

July Mayors Message

On June 13th a public hearing was held regarding the update of two city ordinances; Gravel Pit and Open Burning. The Gravel Pit ordinance (151.70) namely had update in language and deletion of not applicable content. The hours of operation remain 7am-7pm Monday thru Saturday and the operation requirements are unchanged related to noise, dust and road conditions. The Open Burning ordinance (92.00) there was an addition to provide the city office a copy of the DNR burning permit prior to said burn. The ordinance has a list of what can and cannot be openly burned. Full details of both ordinances are available on the city website or contact the City Office with questions.

A radar speed sign has been placed by the Loon Park on Hwy 4 coming into the city. The sign was provided by Otter Tail County following results from the speed study conducted last summer. This area is especially concerning with the park and the number of kids in the area. The hope is to add additional signs to the community in areas where concerns have also been raised. There has been an increase in concerns related to traffic and kids on bikes or running on streets. Please be alert!

Another concern that has been raised to the city this summer is keeping lawns mowed and trimmed; as thistle and other noxious weed move into neighboring property and impacts the appearance of the neighborhood. City Ordinance (92.38) notes property owners are responsible for trimming, removal, cutting, or disposal and elimination of weeds, grasses, rank vegetation or uncontrolled plant growth on their property that is in excess of 12 inches in height.






Proper Disposal of Fats,

Oils and Grease



F.O.G. clogs sewer pipes and causes blockages that result in costly sewer backups and overflows.



Most of us know grease as the byproduct of cooking. Grease is found in such things as:

Meat fats, Cooking oil, Shortening, Butter and margarine, Food scraps, Sauces, Dairy products, Baking goods.

Too often, grease is washed into the plumbing system, usually through the kitchen sink. Grease sticks to the insides of sewer pipes both on your property and in the streets. Over time, the grease can build up and block the entire pipe. Home garbage disposals do not keep F.O.G. out of the plumbing system. These units only shred solid material into smaller pieces and do not prevent F.O.G from going down the drain.
